

Opening Speech at Sustainable Cities And Human Settlements Awards Ceremony 2020

Ladies and Gentlemen,

After two days of a very intensive agenda, with an impressive set of high-level speakers and highly qualified experts, it is time to relax a bit while recognising outstanding sustainable cities related achievements. This is the night of the awardees of the 15th Annual Session of the Global Forum on Human Settlements. Since 2005, the GFHS has been actively promoting green cities and sustainable human settlements, not just through conferences, debates and publications, but also but praising a limited number of outstanding achievements, to serve as examples to others in their fight against destruction of natural resources and production of waste, while pursuing their journey towards sustainability.
